Message from the Chairman's Desk

Marathwada as a region in Maharashtra has one of the largest prevalences of blindness in the country. This region has also lacked the infrastructure needed for education and treatment of patients with visual health problems until the late Dr. Badrinarayan R. Barwale, a well-known industrialist and Philanthropist from the region decided to set up a state-of-the-art facility to support the eye care needs of this region. Dr. Barwale who is the founder of Mahyco Grow group, set up Shri Ganapati Netralaya, a state-of-the-art, non-profit, multi-speciality eye care institute at Jalna in December 1992.

The hospital has been modelled on the lines of Sankara Nethralaya, Chennai, one of the best eye care facilities in the country, which Dr. Barwale had to visit in the late eighties for his own treatment. This experience of travelling to another farther location for the eye care brought a realization in Dr. Barwale, about the non-availability of affordable eye care infrastructure to common population of the region, and spurred him to set up the facility. The vision of Dr. Barwale has been to make available state-of-the-art and affordable eye care to particularly rural population of the region.

Introduction

Shri Ganapati Netralaya is 101 bedded a non-profit super speciality tertiary eye institute run by Mahyco Research Foundation Trust. Shri Ganapati Netralaya, a charitable trust eye hospital is the leading provider of eye health services and a world-class centre of excellence for ophthalmic research and education.

The hospital has been functional since 31st Dec 1992, and our reputation for providing the highest quality of ophthalmic care has been developed and enhanced over 33 years of quality service. Our 210 full-time and part-time staff are committed to sustaining and building on our pioneering history, and ensuring we remain at the cutting edge of developments in ophthalmology. Eye Camps

Apart from the Patients visiting the hospital for treatments, SGN provides eye care support to rural population in the surrounding geography of the Hospital through Eye Camps. Eye camps are conducted by hospital professionals to carry out a limited eye intervention. Eye camps are the most effective way of providing eye care services to a large number of people in a short time. We conduct the eye camps with the cooperation of the local administration in the rural areas of Jalna & Buldhana districts. The needy people attend these camps to get free check-ups and treatment. In these eye camps basic services were provided such as screening, refraction, providing medicines to address allergies and other eye conditions, and identification of cataracts and other surgical cases.

In the year 2024-25, we had conducted 51 camps in the rural areas of the Jalna & Buldhana districts. In these eye camps, 8,008 patients were screened, and out of these 2,435 patients who were identified as persons requiring surgical treatment were brought to Jalna, and surgeries were done in Shri Ganapati Netralaya at free of cost and concessional rates depending on the financial status of the patients. 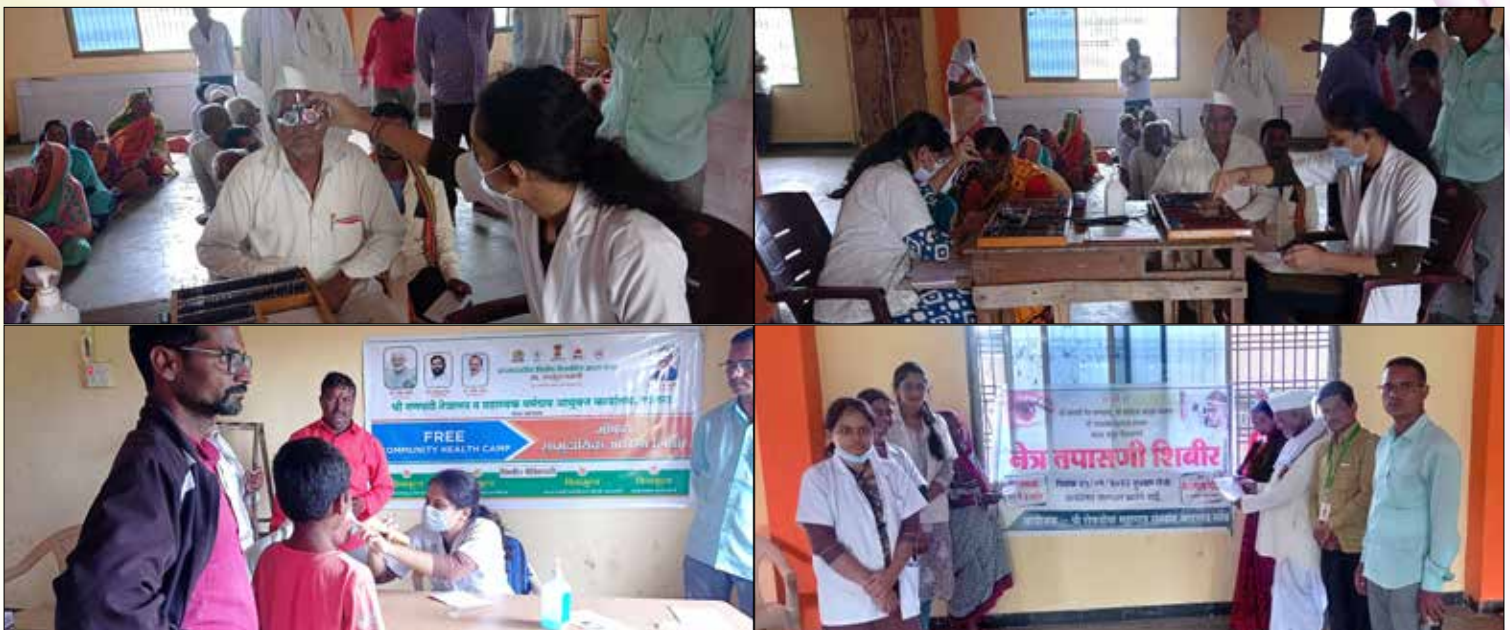

Eye Camps Held in Schools

Many school kids are facing different eye problems like refractive errors, dry eyes, weak eye muscles/nerves, Squint eyes, seasonal allergies like Conjunctivitis, etc. Many times these eye problems are not detected. The reason may be that the child does not complain about the eye problem. Shri Ganapati Netralaya organized free eye check-up camps for children in these schools where they are screened for eye problems. Parents of kids having eye issues are counseled and guided about the case.

Education/Teaching programs

The hospital has two primary and secondary seats respectively. To date, sixty-nine (69) medical graduates have completed their DNB from Shri Ganapati Netralaya.

Bachelor of Optometry : Shri Ganapati Netralaya, offers Bachelor of Optometry offers a four-year professional degree course affiliated to MUHS, Nashik university. The total student intake capacity is 90 (1st year to 4th year). This is a four years (4) course, three (3) years regular classes and one (1) year full time internship. Qualified and experienced faculty is available for teaching. College is having audio-visual class room with internet connectivity, state of art infrastructure and library for the students. Total number of books available in library for the students are around three hundred (300). Along with these gym facility is also available for students.
